Did You Know?

Noongar Seasons: This month we are in the season of Bunuru. Bunuru is the hottest time of the year with little to no rain. Hot easterly winds continue with a cooling sea breeze most afternoons – if you're close to the coast. Traditionally this was, and still is, a great time for living and fishing by the coast, rivers and estuaries. Because of this, freshwater foods and seafood made up major parts of the Noongar people's diet during Bunuru. Bunuru is also a time of the white flowers with lots of white flowering gums in full bloom, including jarrah, marri and ghost gums.

Children's Mental health Week – **7- 13th Feb** : Children's Mental Health Week encourages communities, schools, parents and students to share knowledge on health and wellbeing to children. Mental health has increasingly become a matter of concern around the globe, particularly for children and adolescents. Issues such as lack of resources and support, fear and stigma have limited conversations from taking place around emotional wellbeing. Recent studies have shown that about 1 in 7 children and adolescents aged between 4 to 17 have recently experienced a mental disorder in Australia. As an interconnected society it is our collective responsibility to guide younger generations to be better equipped for their journey to adulthood.

13 Feb Anniversary of Apology to Members of the Stolen Generations: On 13 February 2008, the Australian Parliament made a formal apology to members of the Stolen Generation.

15 Feb Nirvana Day: An annual Buddhist festival that remembers the death of the Buddha when he reached Nirvana at the age of 80.

21 Feb International Mother Language Day: The United Nations' International Mother Language Day celebrates linguistic and cultural diversity.

Shrove Tuesday: Shrove Tuesday is the English name for what is known in some other countries as Mardi Gras (French for 'Fat Tuesday') or Carnival in Spanish and Portuguese countries and is the last day before Lent for many Christian communities. Famous celebrations include the Brazilian Carnival in Rio De Janeiro and the New Orleans Mardi Gras. It is observed in many Christian communities through participating in confession and absolution, the ritual burning of the previous year's Holy Week palms, finalizing one's Lenten sacrifice, as well as eating pancakes and other sweets.

Tibetan New Year (Losar): Losar is a festival in Tibetan Buddhism. The holiday is celebrated on various dates depending on location (Tibet, Bhutan, Nepal and India). The holiday is a new year's festival, celebrated on the first day of the lunisolar Tibetan calendar.

22 Feb Ash Wednesday: Ash Wednesday is the first day of Lent in the Christian calendar. Lent involves 40 days of fasting and reflection that concludes with Easter.




