Upcoming Cultural Events

Bunuru - February - March - long days and short nights signify Bunuru, the hottest of the 6 seasons. Traditionally this was, and still is, a great time for living and fishing by the coast, rivers and estuaries.

1 March signifies the end of Summer and the beginning of Autumn. Autumn in most parts of Australia is from March to May. 1 March St David's Day - St David is the patron saint of Wales.

6 March - Monday 6 March is the Labour Day public holiday. Labour Day is an annual holiday to celebrate the achievements of workers. Labour Day has its origins in the labour union movement, specifically the eight-hour day movement, which advocated eight hours for work, eight hours for recreation, and eight hours for rest.

6 March - Makha Bucha Day - Makha Bucha is celebrated on the full moon day of the third lunar month in Cambodia, Laos, Thailand, Sri Lanka, and on the

full moon day of Tabaung in Myanmar. Theravada Buddhists celebrate by going to temples with offerings of food and other items for the monks or nuns.

Often there are solemn candlelight processions.

6 -7 March - Purim - Purim commemorates the time when the Jewish people living in the ancient Achaemenid Persian empire were saved from extermination by a courageous young Jewish woman named Esther and her uncle and adviser Mordechai.

ATTENDANCE

The most powerful thing any parent can do is to ensure that their child is at school every day and on time. When a child misses time at school, it can add up over the years.

More than 100 years of research has shown us that children who do not attend school regularly tend to have lower levels of school achievement and are more likely to show under-developed social skills compared to their classmates. Children who miss school frequently often fall behind in their learning and find it hard to maintain friendships.

This year, the school will be using attendance data to identify children who are at risk of educational under achievement due to irregular attendance or frequent late starts.

If you are worried about your child's attendance or finding it hard to set boundaries, please talk to your child's teacher or book an appointment with Mrs Joss or one of the Deputies via the Front Office.


