Dear Parents and Carers,

NAPLAN: Congratulations to all the Year 3 and 5 students who participated in NAPLAN testing. We are very proud of everyone's efforts. When the data is released, we will use this to inform our planning for school improvement and classroom teaching programs.

Behaviour Management: I am very pleased to inform our learning community that we will be participating in the 'WAPBiS' program, (Western Australia Positive Behaviour in Schools). Next Wednesday, the WAPBiS team are undertaking their first lot of training. I realise there is a lot of chatter about tracking sheets and their place in our school. Tracking sheet entries will be used to inform Teaching Points in the WAPBiS process. This data will be used as part of our Behaviour Management review as we formulate, 'Expectations of Behaviour'. The learning community will be provided the opportunity to engage in this process soon.

Japanese Cultural Day: Thank you to Sensei Pitcher for organising and coordinating this wonderful day! We also have an incursion planned as part of the day. Please make sure monies are paid by Monday, 27 March.

ANZAC Day Assembly: We will be holding our assembly for ANZAC day on Thursday, 6 April . Thank you Ms Baile for organising this important mark of respect.

Cultural events:

Djeran April to May - the Noongar season of Djeran. This season is marked by cooler nights, dewy mornings and when leaves fall to the ground. *Ngari* (salmon) are prolific.

International Trans day of Visibility 31 March - International Trans Day of Visibility which celebrates transgender individuals and raises awareness of the discrimination transgender communities often face. It is an annual international celebration of trans pride and recognises trans and gender diverse experiences and achievements. It is a day where stories are shared, conversations are initiated and experiences are told.

Ramadan 2 April to 1 May - the most sacred month in the Islamic faith, Ramadan symbolises the cleansing of the heart and mind. Ramadan signifies one of the 5 pillars in Islam. Muslims aim to be disciplined physically and spiritually by abstaining from food and water from sunrise to sunset. The month highlights the importance of not only fasting for physical purposes but to remove negative qualities in oneself and the intention to develop virtues of patience, generosity and overall goodness.

Fan Dance Day 3 April - Fan Dance Day which celebrates the long history of the traditional fan dance in Asia. With brightly coloured kimonos and fans, it acknowledges the important art form that has been around for centuries. Performances typically have live traditional music and are enjoyed by people from all around the world.

Children's day 4 April - celebrated in Hong Kong and Taiwan, Children's Day is a day filled with fun, enjoyment and laughter. It is a day that celebrates the beauty of children in our society and the innocence they bring to family's lives.

International Day of Conscience 5 April - Established by the United Nations General Assembly, the International Day of Conscience promotes peaceful relations and recognition of human rights and fundamental freedoms for all irrespective of race, ethnicity, gender, language or religion. To have conscience is to be sincerely aware of one's intentions and be conscious of morality at all times. Encouraging social interaction with people from different cultures, faiths and beliefs is essential in order to live in joy and peace with each other.

Good Friday April 7—**Good Friday**, the Friday before Easter, is the day on which Christians annually observe the commemoration of the Crucifixion of Jesus Christ.


