


14 July – Bastille Day: This day marks the end of monarchy and the beginning of the French Revolution.



#### CHOIR ~ JUNIOR AND SENIOR DALE FEST

This term, both senior and junior choirs attended the annual Dale Fest, the local singing festival which is open to all schools in the Dale district. This was the first time we performed to an audience since 2019 due to COVID, so it was lovely to have a live audience again and be able to share our music with the wider community, including the Minister for Education, Dr Tony Buti.

All choirs in Dale Fest attended a workshop before the performance in which we learned a whole new song that we performed together less than half an hour later! For the performance section, each school sang one song and then joined the others in community songs.

The Senior Choir performed *Wired for Sound*, an 80's song all about the different ways of listening to music (up to the 80's, that is!) and the juniors sang *Doin' It*, a song about nature in the garden, to fit this year's theme of 'science'.
