Did you know?

The Noongar Season 'Kambarang' is represented by the colour yellow as it symbolises the return of the hot weather. During Kambarang season, we see an abundance of colours and flowers exploding all around us. The yellows of many of the acacias continue to abound, along with some of the banksias and many

other smaller delicate flowering plants including the kangaroo paw and orchids. One of the most striking displays of flowers to be seen during this season will be the moojar, or Australian Christmas Tree (Nuytsia floribunda). The bright orange-yellow flowers serve to signal the heat is on its way.

November 25 National Play with Dad - encourages fathers to spend the day focused on fun with their kids. It's a day designed for bonding and memories.

November 27 Maaveerar Naal - 'Great Heroes' Day; is a remembrance day observed by Sri Lankan Tamils to remember the deaths of militants who fought for the Liberation Tigers of Tamil Eelam, Traditionally, oil lamps are lit for the three days ending on 27 November and the Tamil Eelam flag is raised at ceremonies. The symbol for Maaveerar Naal is the 'Gloriosa superba'.

November 27 November - First Sunday of Advent. Advent is observed with the lighting of advent candles, display of wreaths and special ceremonies. Advent also anticipates the coming again to earth of Jesus Christ.

November 30 St Andrews Day - St Andrew is the patron saint of Scotland. He is also the patron saint of Romania, Greece, Russia,

Ukraine and Poland. The day is usually celebrated with traditional recitations, cuisine, dancing and singing.

'Movember' - Movember is an annual event involving the growing of moustaches during the month of November to raise awareness of men's health issues. It is a portmanteau of the Australian-English diminutive word for moustache, "mo", and "November".

Excursions: This week our school leaders had their 'thankyou' excursion to Bounce. The children's behaviour was exemplary and they had a wonderful time. They even convinced Mr Shoesmith and Mr Fletcher to join them in the activities!

The Animal Warriors went to the Zoo on Wednesday. These students are a passionate group who are concerned about the welfare of animals and meet weekly with Mrs Ritchie for this extracurricular club.


